Family Caregiver Support Program

There are two groups of eligible clients that can receive services under the FCSP: Adult, non-paid family member, or other individual, who is an informal provider of in-home and community care to an individual 60 years of age and older. Grandparent or older individual who is a relative caregiver (grandparent or step-grandparent, or a relative by blood or marriage) who is 60 years of age or older who lives with a child and is the primary caregiver to the child.
